

# Museum to Nanataki Falls

Museum to trailhead: 0.6km (one-way)

Trailhead to Nanataki Falls: 2.8km (one-way)

To Hell Valley (Ojigokudani), Mt. Iwate  
From the area around Nanataki Falls, the number of beech trees increases.  
large-diameter Japanese oak found here

Sakhalin firs planted here

Continue along the mountain trail to your left at the terminus of the forest road  
Sakhalin firs grow nearby

Matsukawa Power Plant water intake facility

Yakkiri stream



The mountain trail and forest road join briefly.  
The mountain trail then breaks away and continues to the left.

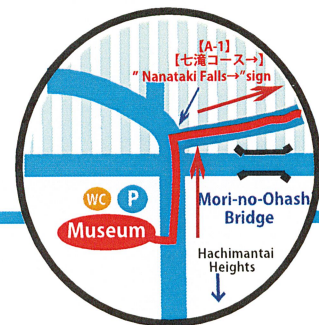

## Route from the museum to the trailhead:

One-way: 0.6km, 20min

- ① From the museum, cross the panorama line (public road) and enter the Prefectural Citizens' Forest
- ② After about 10m, turn right at the sign marked 【七滝コース⇒】 ("Nanataki Falls ⇒") and continue along the paved road.
- ③ Continue along the same path when you see the sign 【A-2】. When the hot spring tank is visible on the right, it is just a little further to climb to the trailhead.
